1 The Monaco Red Cross, a history of values

Created on 3rd March 1948 by Prince Louis II, the Monaco Red Cross was recognised in the same year by the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC). It is one of the 192 national societies belonging to the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement and respects the seven fundamental principles: humanity, impartiality, neutrality, independence, voluntary service, unity, and universality.

The main missions of the Monaco Red Cross are to help the most vulnerable individuals impartially and without discrimination, to save lives and to prepare the population for disasters, and to conduct awareness and prevention campaigns of a humanitarian nature. It acts both domestically and internationally.

The Monaco Red Cross was presided over successively by Prince Rainier III from 1949 to 1958, followed by Princess Grace from 1958 to 1982. Since 17th December 1982, it has been presided over by H.S.H. Prince Albert II, whose 40-year presidency was celebrated in December 2022.

+ Because toddlers are the citizens of tomorrow...

The Rosine Sanmori Day-care Centre, in tribute to the lady who was Vice-President of the Monaco Red Cross for 46 years (from 1968 to 2014), is a care facility for young children. Every year, it welcomes **40 children** from 3 months to 2 years old and **50 children** aged between 2 and 4.

To make the children aware of the world that surrounds them, a multidisciplinary team works alongside the day-care centre's staff, hosting specific workshops that offer the children the music, as well as nature and the environment. Yoga is also a tool that enables the children to learn how to relax and to listen to their emotions.





The introductory workshops for English, Spanish and Italian give the children a chance to familiarise themselves with foreign languages, while in the nursery sign language is taught to babies enabling them to communicate at a much earlier age. The “Snoezelen” workshop, based on sensory stimulation, promotes feelings of wellbeing and a sense of security in babies. This workshop is complementary to the “yoga-drum” workshop



As for the eldest, an awakening to the world of grownups is underway... The children will focus on professions based on the theme “When I am a grown-up, I will be...” Throughout the year, the children will be introduced to professions in catering, security, and health.

However, the efforts of the Red Cross are also geared towards parents: in addition to talks organised on specific topics, courses on sign language, massage for babies, and first aid techniques are organised to meet parents' expectations and support them in any challenges that may be posed by parenthood.

+ The young generation on the move

While toddlers are the citizens of tomorrow, **the younger generation is on the move....**

Since the Youth Section was established in 2021, the number of volunteers has steadily been increasing with a **hundred or so young adults** actively involved in CRM today.

Actions, challenges, and a vital intergenerational bond.



CRM's younger members show no hesitation in taking part in the various actions implemented, in particular **Cleaning Day**: these one-day events, focused on spreading awareness of actions that are beneficial to the environment, provide an opportunity to collect waste within the Principality.



The **Monaco Red Touch Challenge** is a competition created by the Monaco Red Cross, the aim of which is to support various projects devised by young individuals focused on environmental, societal, ecologic, and economic issues.

Having met resounding success in 2022, the competition has been replicated internationally among other Red Crosses:

In 2023, the Monaco Red Cross's youth section continues to develop its projects, perpetuating its commitment on the international scene through various networks. ("The French'Co" presided over by CRM until 30th June 2023, SEYN, EYN...) while actively looking for new volunteers.

It also strives to strengthen **the intergenerational bond** by visiting seniors in retirement homes and by organising dinners.



International actions, first aid and training, social welfare, health-prevention, and also an environmental mission, form the core of the tasks assumed by the Monaco Red Cross.

+ Dedication beyond our borders

International relations:

The Monaco Red Cross belongs to the largest international humanitarian movement and responds to every request for financial support and assistance made by the International Federation and the International Red Cross Committee.

International relief:

In 2022, the Monaco Red Cross responded to **international emergency needs** through the provision of financial assistance amounting to **€1,800,000**. Close to €1,260,000 dedicated to individuals impacted by the conflict in Ukraine, over €240,000 dedicated to various natural disasters (floods, earthquakes, cyclones, hurricanes), €190,000 donated to the food crisis in Africa, €80,000 for migration in the Mediterranean.



International humanitarian aid:

CRM took action in **8 countries** with **12 international solidarity projects** in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Bosnia Herzegovina, Syria, Armenia, and Italy.

Its areas of action are varied: protection, education, health, water, as well as sanitation, first aid and migration. The goal of CRM is to support local populations through long-term projects so that they become resilient.

Migration:

In cooperation with the Italian Red Cross, CRM is actively involved alongside CARITAS INTEMELIA in the Ormea Centre. Three to four times a week, volunteers reinforce the local teams and distribute meals to around **5,135 beneficiaries**.

In this facility reserved for **unaccompanied child migrants**, CRM organises fun educational workshops run by its volunteers but also Sciences Po students who have chosen to carry out their civic learning programme with the Red Cross.

+ Lifesaving techniques at the heart of CRM's action

Favourite first-aid activities: **preventive emergency measures and courses on lifesaving techniques in the Principality.**

An ever-increasing number of first-aid stations that cover all events in the Principality (in 2022 **193 events in the Principality, care provided to 516 individuals** in the first-aid stations).



Football matches, basketball matches, gym competitions, theatre, all types of racing, GP, athletics events, swimming events, rugby competitions... but the teams also provide support during events abroad, specifically to reinforce first-aid staff alongside Red Cross national societies: Belgian Grand Prix, Nimes Feria, Cologne Carnival, and Nice Ironman. The Larvotto first-aid station will once again operate all day throughout July and August. In cooperation with the Marine and Airport Police Division, a total of **5 to 6 daily interventions** were jointly conducted.

Focus on training:

In the Principality, “lifesaving techniques” courses are free and provided by the Monaco Red Cross. However, the resources employed, and staff made available represent a significant cost for our organisation



In 2022, **3,800 people were taught** the basic techniques. As a result and to ensure its actions can continue free of charge, the Monaco Red Cross asks individuals and entities that have received training to contribute towards the substantial cost of the course.

For information, in the Principality all children are taught basic first-aid techniques **from the age of 12**, and induction courses are also set up in primary schools.

Online courses (e-learning) complements classroom-based training and in 2023, CRM will continue to offer modern tools by developing training videos via an e-learning platform, as well as an application for smartphones which will be available in April.

+ People in difficulty : CRM offers strong support

The Monaco Red Cross is active throughout the year, both in emergency situations and by offering regular support to those in need. These protection and assistance measures are at the heart of the association's activity.

The social welfare department, always extremely busy, has been all the more so due to the conflict in Ukraine with the arrival in the Principality and neighbouring area of families fleeing the battle zones.



Action for the Ukrainian people

Over 800 Ukrainian people in addition to local beneficiaries, who are provided care on a regular basis, were offered assistance.

Concerning aid provided to Ukrainian families and in response to the emergency situation of the first few days, thanks to the support of a large number of donors, the department was able to release relief in cash and in the form of food vouchers.

This operation formed part of the arrangements set up in the Principality to welcome and offer guidance to individuals, as well as provide material support, food, and clothing. The Alliance Française offered French language training to displaced individuals from Ukraine staying in Monaco.



These actions are being continued in 2023 and the Monaco Red Cross has demonstrated its high level of commitment, and of the Monegasque people, to help those in need during this conflict.

Actions for the local population

The Monaco Red Cross is committed to help vulnerable individuals in Monaco and the neighbouring area who may be experiencing hard times: **assistance and support was given to over 1,100 people in Monaco and the neighbouring area, i.e. close to 520 households** throughout 2022. The teams have to deal with multiple issues on a day-to-day basis. Professional, administrative, family, financial, housing and health problems are part of everyday life for social workers. To help cope with these situations, they listen, offer support, and provide assistance tailored to the individual's needs.

These actions are being continued in 2023 when the global economic crisis hits first and foremost the most fragile. The objective is to support the individuals concerned so that they are able to get through difficult situations as best as possible.

CRM will also help households to manage their budget more efficiently and optimise their food expenditure. The operation **“Une Journée dans mon Assiette”** (One Day on my Plate) was launched in 2023 to support beneficiaries who struggle to cook healthily and eat a balanced diet on a budget.

For our seniors the “Dames en rose” (Ladies in pink) as they are known, represent the gentleness and warmth of a comforting hand.

They are in contact with the residents of the following retirement homes: A Qietüdine, Cap Fleuri, Résidence Bellando de Castro and the Centre Rainier III, as well as patients at the CHPG, these volunteers are proof that the commitment of the Monaco Red towards seniors is unwavering.

In 2022, 424 residents and 860 patients at the CHPG benefitted from handicrafts, moments of sharing, singalongs...



In 2023, the benevolence and importance of **the intergenerational bond will guide actions to be implemented.**

+ Preventive health : a key issue among younger generations

The Monaco Red Cross is keen to implement all public-health themed projects successfully. Health professionals, doctors and nurses, all Monaco Red Cross volunteers, listen, teach, communicate, and explain, in order to prevent risky behaviours and potential addictions.

In 2022, **6,500 individuals in total were educated and/or benefitted from actions implemented by CRM.**

For 2023, the objective is to continue this work with multiple stakes...

Focus on **the dangers of night life** (alcohol, drugs, drink driving) organised by Fight Aids, the Red Cross and Be Safe.

A comprehensive and effective public awareness campaign to prevent risks that anyone may encounter at a night of celebration. In total **2,500 anti-spiking glass covers**, and **2,500 coasters** (drug detector) were distributed.



In schools, to raise student awareness of the **“weight of a satchel”** and the importance of a satchel suitable for the weight of the child (maximum 10%) and his/her morphology, the volunteers intervene in CM2 classes at schools in the Principality, representing approximately **350 students**.

Focus on the “Vous écouter, vous rencontrer” (Listening to you, meeting you) project’s Listening Centre

The “Vous écouter, vous rencontrer” initiative was created with a view to enabling anyone who so wishes to receive individual support. It stems from the **“Mental Health Plan”** supported by the government. Many people facing psychological and/or physical illness, feel the need to talk, to confide in somebody but struggle to find a listening ear among their friends and families.

Since the project was launched, **696 sessions** have been conducted. In addition to the listening centre, the teams organise home visits and outings (restaurants, walks, theatre, for example) to brighten up the day and enable beneficiaries to enjoy some time out

+ The environmental mission, an ongoing concern

To address the climate challenge and the international commitments of our President, the Monaco Red Cross decided to join the Principality of Monaco's Pact for the Energy Transition in 2019.

It also made a commitment in 2021, like several other National Societies, by signing the Charter on Climate and Environment for Humanitarian Organisations whose aim is to stimulate and drive collective action in response to climate and environmental crises.

A whole series of actions have already been implemented in order to comply with the obligations laid down by the Pact and the Charter. Others have already been planned for the months and years ahead.

For this reason, we have implemented several actions throughout the year with a view to raising the awareness of both the public and the various stakeholders involved on climate-related issues. These different actions have led to partnerships with the Princess Grace Hospital for actions relating to Sustainable Development and extremely constructive discussions.

Various “Cleaning Days” were also set up in cooperation with SMA throughout 2022 and 2023. These actions, aimed at cleaning certain areas of the Principality, gave participants the opportunity to fully appreciate the damaging effects of waste on our environment.

+ The Robbie Williams concert



2022 releases the album XXV and marks the fact - remarkable, improbable, indisputable - that it is twenty-five years later, Robbie Williams tumbled out of the boy band Take That into a solo career that no one, not even him, could yet quite imagine.

What has happened since then... well, part of the story can be told through the swagger of sales and statistics: over 85 million albums sold around the world.

2023 is likely to be one of the most exciting years in Robbie Williams' career. After a stunning comeback in 2022, the singer seems to have decided to double his efforts this year as his biggest tour is launched with over 70 dates. The XXV tour offers a fresh perspective and features revisited or as Robbie might say, "reworked, reimagined and re-loved" versions of his oldest song "Angels", to the most recent, "Lost".

This act of re-imagining and re-loving is partly musical: each song has been orchestrated - by Jules Buckley, Guy Chambers and Steve Sidwell - and the results recorded in the Netherlands by the renowned Metropole Orkest. But as Robbie also sang and tackled these songs again - or, as he puts it, "found himself competing with a very young me on many tracks".

On the album sleeve, Robbie sits naked. "It's Rodin: The Thinker," he says. "Except it's Me: The Thinker-ish." He posed like that because, any higher concerns aside, when needs be that's the kind of thing he does: "I got up on a plinth and spent a few hours having my photograph taken while 23 strangers looked at me in the nude." Unquestionably intriguing, his concert promises a thousand surprises at the Monaco Red Cross Gala at Salle des Étoiles.

About Philippe Geluck



A true one-man band - cartoonist, comedian, actor, radio and tv personality – Philippe Geluck was born in Brussels in 1954.

After graduating from the Institut Supérieur Arts de la Scène (INSAS)*, he started his career as an actor in some of Belgium's major theatres for ten or so years. In 1976, he founded the Théâtre Hypocrite.

At the same time, Philippe Geluck drew and exhibited his wacky drawings and watercolours in galleries in Brussels, Paris, London, Milan, Copenhagen, Neuchâtel, and Dallas.

On 22nd March 1983, at the request of the newspaper *Le Soir*, *Le Chat* (The Cat) appeared for the first time in the national daily's supplement. Very quickly, it became the paper's mascot. Since then, over 8,000 comic strips have been published, but have also appeared in the Spanish, Portuguese, German, Iranian, Swiss, Dutch, Italian and American press.

Since 1986, 23 albums of the Cat have been released by the publishers Casterman, as well as six "best ofs", *Geluk se lâche*, *Geluk enfonce le clou* and *Geluk pète les plombs*. Three exhibition catalogues can be added to this bibliography: *Le Chat s'expose*, *L'Art et Le Chat* and *Le Chat déambule*.

As far as his television career is concerned, since 1979, Philippe Geluck has created or presented close to 1,500 TV shows with his humoristic stamp. From 1999 to 2006, he appeared on France 2 in *Vivement Dimanche Prochain* hosted by Michel Drucker. And since 2000, he has been one of the pillars of the Ruquier gang in the show *On a tout essayé*.

For the 20th anniversary of the Cat in 2003, the Ecole Nationale des Beaux-Arts de Paris hosted a major exhibition on Geluck, which then moved on to Brussels and Rennes attracting over 350,000 visitors. Since then, his drawings, paintings and sculptures have

been displayed in various contemporary art galleries and shows. The exhibition L'Art et Le Chat in 2016 delighted adults and initiated the younger generations to a selection of iconic works in the History of Art.

Today, Philippe Geluck is actively preparing the opening of the Musée du Chat et du Dessin d'Humour in Brussels in 2026. Meanwhile, he is organising a travelling exhibition featuring 20 monumental sculptures of Le Chat in the urban environment. The tour, *Le Chat déambule*, was inaugurated in March 2021 on the Champs Elysées, before reaching the quays of Bordeaux in the summer. The statues were then moved to Caen for the winter, Geneva in February 2022, in Monaco in July and in Montreux in September. Since March 2023, the exhibition has been held in the Parc Royal in Brussels.
